This year in particular marks the culmination of years of hard work as we paved the way for major capital projects and meaningful program delivery across the watershed. A major highlight was the completion and opening of the Accessible Bridge and Education Platforms at Baxter Conservation Area. This project represents a significant step toward making nature accessible to all, and we are incredibly proud of this achievement. We look forward to continuing this journey with you as we move into Phase II, which will focus on the construction of accessible trails and boardwalks at Baxter.

We were also thrilled to increase support for outdoor education subsidies for schools, students, and families who face financial barriers. These subsidies ensure that all young people, regardless of their background, can connect with nature, learn about conservation and develop a lifelong appreciation for the environment. It's an investment not only in their education but in the future stewardship of our watershed.

We also welcomed another 80 hectares of natural lands into our care this year, further advancing our mission to preserve vital ecosystems for future generations. 2024 Highlights

Celebrating Our Success

We appreciate your continued trust and support of the RVCF. Your commitment to funding programs and projects helps protect our beautiful watershed, both now and for future generations. Here's a glimpse of what we've accomplished together in 2024:

- Celebrated opening of boardwalk bridge and education platforms thanks to funding from Canada's Community Revitalization Fund, City of Ottawa Rural Community Building Grant, RVCA support and many generous donors.
- Launched Phase II fundraising and began construction of 950 meters of accessible boardwalk and trails at the Baxter Conservation Area.
- Welcomed a generous donation of 80 hectares, securing the long-term protection of forests, lake shorelines and Provincially Significant Wetlands.
- Secured funds from the Federal Environment and Climate Change Canada Challenge Fund and other private donors to support the acquisition of conservation land.
- Protected 3,463 hectares (8,556 acres) of conservation land throughout the Rideau watershed.
- Continued the acquisition of local natural lands thanks to ongoing funding support from Modern Niagara, which has allowed us to acquire 994 acres and secure easements on 460 acres during four years of partnership. This effort has helped sequester 350,767 tonnes of carbon so far.



- Facilitated two Planned Giving workshops focused on estate planning and land donations. A special thank you to IG Wealth Management and Kelly Santini LLP for generously sharing their expertise in financial and estate planning.
- Secured funding to enhance the shoreline buffer on conservation land. Thanks to TD Friends of the Environment, 1,000 native shrubs and trees will be planted in 2025.
- Continued partnership with Hulse, Playfair and McGarry to plant 1,500 trees seedlings annually.
- Planted 508 memorial and special occasion trees in tribute of loved ones.
- Welcomed back returning Carbon Neutral individuals, businesses and events including Capital Pyro, LiVE 88.5, Elephant Print, Greek Fest Ottawa, McCooeye Wealth Management – Mandeville Private Client Inc., Somersault Events and Velofix Ottawa.
- Celebrated the installation of the Baxter Story Trail made possible thanks to TD Friends of the Environment




- Supported community science, invasive species removal and garbage clean ups along Ottawa's Graham Creek with special funding from the Danbe Foundation and Accora Village
- Earned the continued confidence of several land development companies who use the Foundation's Species at Risk Compensation Program services to compensate for the unavoidable loss of butternut or barn swallow, bobolink and meadowlark habitat during their business activities. We are currently managing 40 projects.
